SAFETY FIRST FOR SAFE COMMISSIONING

Commissioning of PDPP is in progress and that of MSBP is only a few months away. In a brief communication, to ensure Pre-Start Up Safety Review requirements for safe start up, CGM (I/c) Kochi Refinery Mr. Subramoni Iyer emphasized on the need for building and maintaining a safety culture. Some of the key points stressed are:

- Take personal responsibility and lead the way in complying with the safety rules and regulations relevant to our work, intervene to eliminate unsafe conditions and prevent unsafe acts while at work.
- Never underestimate the risks involved with machines or equipment.
- Isolation procedures have to be strictly followed especially the practice of Lock Out Tag Out (LOTO) to provide protection to all those who may be working on various equipment including the electrical systems. This will ensure that they are not injured by hazardous releases of energy, hydrocarbons or other gases. All efforts have to be taken to ensure that systems and procedures are followed.
- More focus need to be given on Contractor Safety Management right from tendering, site implementation, safe completion of the works and contractor evaluation.

- Near-miss reporting is vital to enhance the safety system.
- Strictly adhere to all the safety guidelines while issuing permits, carrying out the work and also while engaging others at work.
- Put in best efforts to ensure that Kochi Refinery continues to be a safer, cleaner and greener place to work.

PSM implementation has given us an opportunity to further streamline our processes, strike a good balance between processes and safety thereby enhancing safety and productivity. It has helped in prevention of accidents and reduction in risks associated with plant operations.

Workplace safety is the right of every one working inside the refinery. It is a core value for us and Kochi Refinery is committed to protecting the health and safety of its employees and their families, contractors, customers and the community. We are working tirelessly to improve safety practices through development, training, standards information sharing, and advocacy. Mr. Iyer shared in his communication.



ACCESS CONTROL
