NEW PETROLEUM MINISTER TAKES CHARGE

Mr. Hardeep Singh Puri takes charge as the Hon'ble Minister of Petroleum and Natural Gas and Mr. Rameswar Teli as the Minister of State for Petroleum and Natural Gas. They were welcomed by Education Minister Mr. Dharmendra Pradhan and Petroleum Secretary, Mr. Tarun Kapoor at the Office of the MoP&NG.



Mr. Hardeep Singh Puri has taken charge as the Hon'ble Minister of Petroleum & Natural Gas and & Housing and Urban Affairs. Mr. Puri joined the Indian Foreign Service in 1974. During a career spanning 39 years, served in senior positions at the Ministries of External Affairs and Defence. Held Ambassadorial level assignments in London and Brasilia and served as Permanent Representative of India to the United Nations in Geneva and New York. Earlier served in India's Missions in Tokyo, and Colombo. Mr.Puri has extensive experience in multilateral diplomacy served on three occasions as a member of India's Delegation to the GATT/United Nations in Geneva including as Ambassador and Permanent Representative from 2002 to 2005. Long association with and specialization in trade-related matters and served on several Dispute Settlement Panels of the GATT and WTO.

Served at the headquarters of the Ministry of External Affairs in New Delhi, as Under Secretary in the early 1980s, as Director and Chef de Cabinet to the Foreign Secretary in the early 1990s, as Joint Secretary of the Americas and Europe West Divisions and on deputation to the Ministry of Defence in the 1990s. Permanent Secretary dealing with economic relations in the Ministry of External Affairs from June 2008 to April 2009, before joining as Ambassador and Permanent Representative of India to the United Nations in New York on 4 May, 2009. President of the United Nations Security Council in August 2011 and November 2012. Chairman of the United Nations Security Council Counter-Terrorism Committee in 2011-2012. Retired from the Indian Foreign Service on 28 February, 2013 and joined the International Peace Institute (IPI), New York, a non-profit think tank with headquarters in New York and offices in Vienna and Manama. A member of the Rajya Sabha since 2018, Mr. Puri took over as the Hon'ble Petroleum Minister in July 2021.

MSBP AT KOCHI REFINERY STANDS COMPLETED WITH PENEX UNIT GO LIVE

The world class Penex Unit with an installed capacity 0.7 MMTPA, designed to convert Hydrotreated Light Naphtha into high value Isomerate for blending into Motor Spirit streams goes live at Kochi Refinery. With the feed cut-in on 18 June 2021, this is the third and final unit of the BPCL Motor Spirit Block Project (MSBP) to go fully on-stream. The NHT and CCR units of the MSBP were commissioned earlier and with the commissioning of the Penex Unit, the MSBP at Kochi Refinery now stands fully completed.

Kudos to team MSBP on accomplishing the safe and smooth commissioning of all the three units ahead of schedule, braving all odds of the pandemic, with highest record of contractor safety since inception, completing almost 21.0 Million accident free manhours and also a project costs savings of approx Rs.135 crores.

The Hydro Treated Light Naphtha was taken into the Penex unit after safe and successful catalyst loading in Penex reactors on 18 June 2021. The ceremonial initiation of the feed cut-in was done by Mr. Sanjay Khanna, Executive Director, KR in the presence of Mr. Ajith Kumar K, CGM (Projects), Mr. Chacko M Jose, CGM (Operations), Mr. Kurian P Alapatt, CGM (HR) i/c, Mr. Sreeram N, CGM (Project Technical & Petchem), Mr. Sankar M, CGM(Manufacturing), other senior executives of Kochi Refinery and the MSBP Project and commissioning team. For the mission accomplished in record time, record safety and commendable savings it's all kudos to the execution team led by Mr. Satheesh Kumar KP, GM (Projects) and commissioning team led by Mr. Shajikumar MR, GM (Mfg-1) supported by the consultants, major contractors and all other stakeholders.

PDPP ACRYLATES UNIT INAUGURATED BY DIRECTOR (FINANCE)

Marking another important milestone in the Petrochemicals journey of Bharat Petroleum at Kochi Refinery, Mr. Vijayagopal N, Director (Finance), inaugurated the Acrylates Unit of PDPP by launching the first product routing of the niche petrochemical Butyl Acrylate from the unit to the Tank farm.

Director (Finance) inaugurated the Product Transfer pump PDE-P-551A in the august presence of Executive Director Mr. Sanjay Khanna, Executive Director (Kochi Refinery) and Chief General Managers, Mr. Sriram S (E&AS), Mr. Sreeram AN (Petchem), Mr. Suresh John (Procurement), Mr. Chacko M Jose (Operations), Mr. Ajith Kumar K (Projects), Ms. Geeta Iyer (Finance), Mr. Kurian P Alapatt (HR), Mr. Sankar M, (Manufacturing) and Mr. Senthilkumar GR (Technology) along with the project construction and commissioning teams and other stake-holders at a ceremony in Kochi Refinery on 19 July 2021. After the successful commissioning and product dispatch of Acrylic acid and Oxo Alcohol from the Complex, this is another prestigious moment for team Kochi Refinery.

Technology partner for the Acrylate unit include Mitsubishi Chemical Corporation (MCC), Japan, Engineers India Limited as the Project Management Consultant and M/s Bridge and Roof as the lead Project Mechanical Contractor for Construction with various other contractors. PDE Unit (Acrylates Unit) can produce a total of 180 KTA of Butyl acrylate and 10 KTA of Ethyl Hexyl Acrylate. These niche products are primarily used in paint and adhesives industries.

The entire unit was commissioned with the virtual support from the Project Licensor amidst the travel restrictions due to the covid-19 Pandemic. Mr. Ravi K, General Manager (Projects) along with the project construction team members Mr. George Simon, Chief Manager (Projects), Mr.Yadukrishnan G, Mr Kannan VV Mr. Arjun T Chandran and Ms. Sreeja Kumaran and Mr. Eric Thomas welcomed Director (Finance) to the unit. The team took the chief guest around the state-of- the-art PDPP control room and Mr. A Mahendiran, General Manager (Petchem Commissioning) and Mr. Sandeep Agrawal, DGM (Petchem) along with commissioning team members Mr. Neelanjan Dutta, Mr. Joseph Shaison, Mr. Arunkumar B explained the process flow of the system.

Director (Finance) congratulated the commissioning and construction teams for the excellent work done under the current conditions of pandemic and applauded the efforts taken to commission the Acrylates unit safely and smoothly.





D(F) INAUGURATES 220 KV FEEDER LINE WORKS

The new 220 KV feeder line works at Kochi Refinery was inaugurated by Director (Finance) Mr. N Vijayagopal in the presence of Executive Director, Mr. Sanjay Khanna and Chief General Managers, Mr. Ajith Kumar K (Projects), Mr. Sriram S (E&AS), Mr. Sreeram AN (Petchem), Ms. Geetha V Iyer (Finance), Mr. M Sankar (Manufacturing) and Mr. Kurian P Alapatt (HR) and other dignitaries along with Projects Team on 19 July 2021.

CGM (Projects) Mr. Ajith Kumar K welcomed Director (Finance) at the site inside FACT area. After the ceremonial initiations, Mr. Vijayagopal inaugurated the cable laying activities inside the newly constructed cable trench by switching on the winch puller. Director (Finance) also cut a milestone-cake to mark the completion of the 220 KV cable trench by the Projects Team. CGM(Projects) briefed about the milestone crossed by the team and also showed the dignitaries the site grading works in the newly acquired land inside FACT.

The 3km long 220 KV cable trench is constructed from the recently inaugurated 220 KV GIS substation at Jwalagiri area to the KSEB Brahmapuram Substation. The challenging activity of construction of the cable trench passing through Refinery area and the newly procured land inside FACT was completed within a span of 12 months amidst two Covid-19 Pandemic lockdowns in the marshy soil and also the vicinity of live KSEB HT lines. Once the 220KV feeder line is charged, the existing 220 KV overhead transmission line passing through Kochi Refinery area will be dismantled. At a jubilant celebration on crossing yet another team-milestone, Mr. PV Ravitej, Executive Director (Refineries) I/c inaugurated the VGO HDT APC and Mr. Sanjay Khanna, Executive Director (Kochi Refinery) inducted the APC Champions at Kochi Refinery at an interactive virtual ceremony on 21 July 2021. The VGO HDT APC controller is the latest addition in Kochi Refinery's long culture of commissioning APC controllers in process units, entirely with in-house resources, without involving any consultant or APC licensor.

Congratulating the Kochi Refinery team on one-more in-house implementation, Mr. Ravitej said, "We should aim for a single APC controller for entire refinery in line with MPIMS for multiple refinery planning. Let us make use of advanced digital technologies including Machine Learning extensively for developing inferential for process parameters with better accuracy. We can keep the logics simple at the DCS control and complex logics can be part of the APC, for a more integrated and compact single APC controller for the entire plant."

The Advanced Process Control (APC) is implemented in process units through a Multivariable Predictive Control (MVC) software that runs parallel with the Distributed Control System (DCS) of the unit. The APC is particularly beneficial for processes having long lead time, complex process dynamics or multiple variables interacting with each other. The APC helps us to operate the process units steadily and safely in a more profitable condition. Using Advanced Process Control, it is possible to operate process units closer to the plant constraints, resulting in increased throughput, better product yields and reduced energy consumption.

As APC implementation is the need of hour, it's being implemented in all units of KR and has been deployed in Vacuum Gas Oil Hydro Treating (VGO HDT) unit in June 2021. The VGO HDT unit was commissioned in KR in 2017 as part of the Integrated Refinery Expansion Project (IREP). The unit provides the feedstock for Petro FCC unit. It is designed for a capacity of 3 MMTPA and the Process Licensor is M/s Shell.

In a virtual ceremony, ED In-Charge (Refineries), Mr. P. V. Ravitej inaugurated the VGO HDT APC at Kochi Refinery on 21 July 2021, in the presence of ED (KR), Mr. Sanjay Khanna, Chief General Managers Mr. Chacko M. Jose (Operations), Mr. Kurian P. Alapatt (HR), Mr. Senthilkumar G. R. (Tech), Mr. M. Sankar, (Manufacturing), Ms. Geeta Iyer, (Finance), Mr. Sanjay Mehrishi (IS) and other >>

The APC implementation was possible with the dedicated support of the Manufacturing, Instrumentation, Process Engineering and IS teams. Benefits post APC Implementation in VGOHDT is estimated at INR 10.6 Crores annually by the optimization of Fuel/Excess oxygen/amine circulation/Utilities across the unit and also a Capex saving of INR 2.0 Crores for APC & DCS related jobs. The controllers are deployed in M/s Aspen Technology's DMC platform. DCS for the VGO HDT unit is Delta V from M/S Emerson. There are four controllers in the VGO HDT APC having 75 MVs and 250 CVs; defining the volume and complexity of process. The biggest controller is of 33 MVs and 77 CVs. All the standard steps of APC implementation were followed and the area Instrument has worked on the DCS interface with the help of DCS vendor.

KOCHI REFINERY APC CHAMPIONS

At the same event, ED (KR) inducted the APC champions, for knowledge sharing at the plant level. The idea of having APC Champions was introduced by ED (KR) at one of the review meetings to enhance the pace of implementation of new controllers and help in maximizing uptime of existing ones and quicker trouble shooting. ED (KR) welcomed the APC champions and opined that APC Champions are the knowledge bank of details of their respective units and this would help in enhancing the efforts by APC team to take the implementation forward and also increase awareness regarding APC benefits.

Mr. Jitendra Kumar Verma presented about VGO HDT APC implementation. APC implementation is a combination of DCS work, APC strategy formulation and regular monitoring complemented by operation, process engineering group, and instrumentation and IS group. With APC already implemented in CDU-2, FCCU, CDU-3, DHDT, VGO HDT and NHT-ISOM units, the KR APC team is developing APCs for Petro FCC, DCU and VGO HDS units currently.




YTTILA TURNS SMARTER

Vyttila junction, one of the busiest in Kochi City, where the Kochi Metro and Vyttila flyover crosses one over the other and two main National Highways cross down below.

As part of the Swachhata Pakhawada, Bharat Petroleum Kochi Refinery has renovated the Vyttila Traffic island and Police Watch tower at this main junction in the heart of Kochi city. BPCL has been maintaining this traffic island since 1997. Due to metro works and the bridge constructions, the watch tower was closed for a few years. The Police watch tower has now been revamped with facilities for day and night vigil at the junction. Safety, Swachhata and COVID awareness messages have been activated on the digital display and the watch tower has been branded with relevant information for public. The Police watch tower also serves as a Police Educational & Information Kiosk.

The renovation and facelift of the junction was completed in less than 10 days to achieve one of the key-Swachhta missions of Kochi Refinery during the Swachhta Pakhwada 2021. The transformation of the Traffic island at the Vyttila junction was completed in collaboration with the Office of the District Police Commissioner and other Govt stakeholders.



WORK MANAGEMENT SYSTEM AT KR

A COLLABORATIVE EFFORT TO GO DIGITAL

With an emphatic thrust on planning to improve productivity of all workforces, the Work Management System (WMS), an online software that enables advance planning of Refinery maintenance activities and communicating the plans to all stakeholders, was recently developed and implemented by the Refinery IS team at Kochi Refinery. This is one among the many initiatives towards Digitalization at KR. A total collaborative effort by MR & KR teams the WMS was devised and designed exclusively for the Maintenance department that has a host of activities critical to the business that are to be logged, followed and closed on a daily basis.

"Effective planning to improve tool-time being the central focus of WMS, each member of the team can now easily appreciate the relevance and criticality of their role. Accountability and reliability is also enhanced when we all know that we are part of the bigger picture," said Mr. Sanjay Khanna, Executive Director (Kochi Refinery) who inaugurated the system on 10 June 2021 in the presence of CGMs, Mr. Chacko M Jose, (Operations) and Mr. Sanjay Mehrishi (IS), GMs Mr. Giridharan S (Maintenance) and Mr. Mathew P Thomas (P&U), other senior officials and team members. ED (KR) appreciated the collaborative efforts of MR & KR members who contributed directly and indirectly to rollout the WMS system successfully in Kochi Refinery.

The integration of the WMS with SAP enables download of all Maintenance notifications and PM orders to the system, and thus provides the users with a centralized location for planning their activities. The WMS has an elegant and intuitive dashboard that excels in providing summarized and key information about the status of jobs. Some of the key business benefits include better planning and coordination, effective monitoring and control, dashboard for faster decision making, elegant user friendly screens for capturing information , innovative templates for quick job updating, notification and alerts to role-holders for better resource planning, job and activity history maintained for future reference and MIS Reports for daily planning and quick action.

The customized WMS for Kochi Refinery is a collaborative effort of the IS teams of KR, MR and the KR Maintenance Department guided by Mr. TV Ramarao, CGM IS & Digital Strategy (MR & KR), Mr. Sanjay Mehrishi, CGM (KR-IS), and Mr. S. Giridharan, GM (Maintenance). Mr. D. Shrikumar, DGM(KR-IS) and Mr. Atul Patil, DGM (MR-IS) were the key team leaders from IS Dept. The Maintenance Task Force at KR was coordinated by Mr. Raghavan.
