NEW NORM IS TO THINK QUICK, **NOT QUICK FIXES!**

Dear colleagues,

I am indeed happy to note the excellent physical performance, both in Refinery & Marketing front, for the quarter and year ended 31st March 2020.

Ever-since the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic, the fundamentals by which the Oil business stood guard have gone for a total upheaval. The industry may be seeing its deepest plunge, but we expect a riveting revival too. In the interim, Oil Companies are looking at slashing capex, balancing short-term needs with long-term goals, which are not just specific to Indian Oil majors, but the world over. I would like to briefly touch upon highlights of performance for the year gone by.

Performance Highlights - 2019-20

Refinery: During the year 2019-20, the aggregate throughput of our refineries at Mumbai and Kochi was 31.91 MMT registering highest ever crude throughput. BPCL is the only OMC to meet the MOU target (102%) on Crude Processing. BPCL Refineries achieved the PAT-2 MBN target and has achieved the lowest ever Specific Energy Consumption.

Marketing: In terms of marketing, we have a registered sales of 43.07 MMT and the only OMC to gain overall market share. We have regained our rightful position as number one in market growth in both MS and HSD in the 4th Quarter. We have commissioned 1447 new retail outlets, the highest among OMCs.

On the financial side, we recorded a standalone loss of ₹1,361 crore for the March quarter of FY20, against a net profit of ₹3,125 crore for the March quarter a year-ago, affected by inventory and forex losses, lower sales and weak refining margins. We had very high inventories due to steep fall in demand not seen in the recent past, coupled with massive decline in global prices. For the full year, the Net profit dropped to ₹2,683 crore from ₹7,132 crore in FY19.

Post COVID Impact

As demand for products has picked up faster than expected, our refinery throughput levels have now come back to more than 80% levels; which was as low as 36 % in April 2020 and 55 % in May 2020.

On account of pandemic, HSD sales was down by 60% while MS sales dropped by 65% in the month of April. However, the drop was lower at about 29% for HSD and 37% for MS in the month of May. We expect both of these to gradually improve to pre-lockdown levels.

Demand is recovering more quickly for MS than HSD, and it would take much longer for consumption of other products such as bitumen and jet fuel to return to levels seen before the pandemic struck.

Early this month, the Singapore crack margin for MS was minus USD 3.47 a barrel and HSD was down to low of USD 4 a barrel. You would appreciate that this will be reflected in the gross refining margins of this quarter. With Brent at USD 40 a barrel now, up from USD 16 in month of April, and restoration of normalcy across globe, GRMs are likely to improve in coming months.

Work from Home became the new norm and we were quick to respond to this change by providing various digital tools to all the employees. This enabled us to perform our official duties seamlessly and efficiently while sitting in the comfort of our home.

Project Outlook

We have decided to rationalize capex partly because there was no significant project activity for the two months in the current financial year and also on account of lower profitability. Saving made out of the above will be used to invest in projects that provide quick & higher returns. This will be reviewed as the situation improves. We took a conscious decision to look afresh at all the new capex proposals especially smaller ones with an outlay of less than Rs. 150 crs. Even for the continuing schemes, we made efforts with a view to optimize expenditure. In hard times, we have to maintain cash and a healthy debt: equity ratio, to be ready to invest more when normalcy is restored.

The bold new norm

As we reel under the global crisis, it will be prudent to say 'Thinking Quick & Not Quick Fixes' is what can help us 'Make it Big!'.

Are we ready for the bold new norms? Lower demand for crude oil and petroleum products has hit both prices and refining margins globally. Demand across the world was hit after countries announced coronavirus-induced lockdown to control the spread of the pandemic. BPCL however, expects fuel demand to return to prelockdown levels after the monsoon season.

As the world's third biggest oil consumer, India imports about 84% of its oil requirements. With China's oil demand recovering to over 90% of levels seen before the coronavirus struck early this year, a potential consumption recovery in India - the world's third largest crude importer - would be good news for oil-producing countries.

It is high time we concentrate on optimizing crude oil throughput, moderating costs, improving our capabilities for forecasting demand and price trends by continued focus on our digital journey. Our priority should shift to improving our bottom line to support our ambitious plans for expanding business and to ensure a strong and healthy liquidity, as business across the globe, is preserving cash for the future.

We believe that despite the current uncertainty and volatility, the fundamentals of our business will remain strong. We need to respond to the current situation by quick thinking, agility and adaptability. Tough times bring out the best in people. Our Company's operations during this period of uncertainty have reaffirmed its image as a caring and responsible organization. BPCL has weathered the storm with minimal impact to its people and with maximum efficiency, catering to the nation's energy needs in a seamless manner.

We have a 100-year history. We began this journey as a Kerosene trader and expanded operations to cover refinery and marketing of petroleum products. We successfully ventured into Exploration & Production and then into gas business. We have evolved over the years into an integrated Oil & Gas company. Going forward, we will transform ourselves as a Global Energy Company. We are here to stay.

Our resilience defines us, our nimbleness enables us and our wisdom will guide us in these tough times. The road ahead is hard, but it shines brighter than the one we leave behind. We are confident that our employees will weather any short term anxieties and reap the benefits of a bright future that lies ahead of us.

All these developmental projects have its own impact on the environment in varying degrees but all efforts were taken at the design and project implementation stages to mitigate these impacts to the minimum level possible so that there are no adverse effects on biodiversity of the region.

BOTH, IN THE ALREADY COMMISSIONED AND STABILIZED IREP AND IN THE UNDER COMMISSIONING PDPP, **WE HAVE INCORPORATED** ADVANCED TECHNOLOGIES, IN-HOUSE INNOVATIONS, **EFFECTIVE PREDICTIVE** MAINTENANCE AND **USE OF ECOFRIENDLY FUELS AT THE DESIGN** STAGE ITSELF.

Our 15.5 MMTPA refinery with the state of the art technology is now producing ecofriendly BS-VI compliant auto fuels. Both, in the already commissioned and stabilized IREP and in the undercommissioning PDPP, we have incorporated advanced technologies, in-house innovations, effective predictive maintenance and use of ecofriendly fuels at the design stage itself.

These activities have ensured that SOx emission from the Refinery is reduced to half as compared to the limits prescribed by Ministry of Environment & Forest. Effluent recycle is reaching its maximum limit thereby reducing the raw water intake. Lesser emission of Hydro Carbon, effective sludge disposal and reduced flare loss has also been successfully done to adhere to the MINAS norms.

In addition to the above actions, Kochi Refinery has taken the initiative to reduce pollution by sending hazardous waste to Co-Processors which is a more sustainable way of managing the hazardous waste. KR is trying different ways to combat the pollution through exchange of effluents among industries for mutual benefit. The in-house emission model developed is capable of showing SOx, NOx, CO, CO2 values from various emission sources from the refinery. These inputs can be effectively utilized to reduce emissions and improve efficiency of fired furnaces.

With 82 different species of plants, close to 45,000 trees, approximately 2,50,000 cubic metre of rain water harvesting pond, maintaining three butterfly parks and nourishing, 250 deers in the district sanctuary, our Refinery, stands amongst the leaders in protecting the environment. Apart from this, we are developing 2 acres for centralized waste management facility for processing plastic, paper, wood and cotton waste. It is estimated that we have sequestered 5294 tons of Carbon dioxide with the continuous tree plantation drives undertaken year after. These initiatives emphasize our continued commitment in maintaining a pollution free environment within the refinery complex and its surroundings.

As Refiners with years of experience in operating one of the finest Refineries in the world, we are aware of the best combinations of actions that can help us operate with least impact on the environment. I urge each one of you to be reminded of that every day. We need to constantly be aware of the fact that every action of ours while operating this Refinery has a direct or indirect impact on the environment. Not just at work, but also at home and our extended society where we carry on our responsibility as invaluable citizens. Let us remind ourselves and also remind our children, that each and every action that we take has a link to every other life on this planet, and we share our planet with them.

GO Green, as we all know, is one of the three pillars of Go-GDP, the corporate vision for the transformational leap of Bharat Petroleum, the others being Go Digital and Go Petrochemicals. In the wake of the pandemic we have been witnessing how digital initiatives are rapidly taking over the way we work and live. Green initiatives, like going paperless, zero-use of plastic, recycle and reuse, promoting etransactions, responsible use of power and natural resources, are simple steps that we have to invest in on a daily basis. LEARNING TEAMS

Most common practice in refinery is that incidents occur and are followed by an incident investigation. It attempts to identify a single root cause and then put in a corrective action to prevent similar incidents from happening in the future.

Criticism with this method is often the report claims that worker made a poor decision and not following procedures. Providing training and perhaps enforcing discipline will help in future. These will be the recommendations of the report generally.

Many companies especially M/s CLG came up with Learning teams principle. The procedures followed in Learning Teams are:

FORMING A TEAM

Learning teams should include workers who perform the job. They know the job and the hazards in best manner and also they know how work really is done. So it is important to include the person involved in the incident and other workers involved in the work/event.

MEET WITH A PURPOSE

Plan and invite the team for meeting

FIRST SESSION BRAINSTORMING

Have different insights and perspectives. Perform a series of questions to help the team fully define and understand the case.

MEET AGAIN

Review what was discussed in first session. Ask the team to explain the best way to fix the problem. Prioritize the recommendations. One star: Simple solutions that team members can implement themselves . Two Star: Requires involvement of management. Three Star: longer-term solutions that will take more time and money.

TAKE A BREAK TAKE SOME TIME OFF.

Let people walk away from the learning team meeting and give an additional thought about the first meeting.

RESULTS

Communicate result of Learning team to the management.

We bring you important take-aways from recent webinars. Here are key-points from the AFPM **Technical Webinar on Learning Teams** shared by Mr. Subramoni Iyer, Chief General Manager (Operations & Commissioning), Kochi Refinery

HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT PORTAL

Mr. Babu Joseph CGM (HSE) inaugurated the Portal that integrates data management and workflow for the ease of all stakeholders. The portal developed by KR IS team would support in total data management and report generation as per needs for various statutory agencies.







CENTRALISED WASTE MANAGEMENT FACILITY AT KOCHI REFINERY

A Centralized Waste Management Facility to handle similar characteristic wastes at one single location has been launched in Kochi Refinery. On the World Environment Day, Mr. P Murali Madhavan, Executive Director (KR) inaugurated the first phase of the facility that has been developed near the IREP Cooling Tower.

This facility together with source segregation helps to reduce the significant impact of handling wastes. Proper segregation can yield better value during disposal. The indigenously designed centralized waste management facility, a first of its kind in Refineries, is our commitment to our motto Greener, safer, Cleaner KR in future. Collection, segregation and disposal of all kinds of nonhazardous wastes like paper, plastic, wood, non-oil soaked insulation, cotton waste, used helmet, duster coat etc will be handled in this two acre plot.

A bio digester, incinerator and plastic shredder machines are envisaged here. It will also have washing and cleaning facilities for plastic cans and drums that are collected inside the refinery and petrochemical complex. A separate area for plastics collection, segregation and shredding is proposed and also an incinerator for incinerating cotton waste, coconut shells, old gloves, duster coat, waste paper etc. The collection center will have separate space for waste paper, boards, plastic cans, plastic drums and wood scrap. Insulation waste (Non-oil soaked) can also be collected in the proposed site which will then be sent for co-processing in cement factory kiln.

Post IREP commissioning, the waste generation at the refinery had increased tremendously and it required segregation at source for disposal in a scientific manner. Sustainability being the key factor today for any business, healthy waste management can only add value as it protects our costly land without spoil by landfill with wastes.

WIDE EYED LIKE A CHILD, I BID GOODBYE

I was mentally a part of erstwhile Cochin Refineries Limited, and even beyond. From that era of M/s Procon, the prime contractors constructing Cochin Refineries Limited, where my father was working as an Engineer then, to the erstwhile Cochin Refineries Limited dedicated to the nation by the then Prime Minister Smt Indira Gandhi, before he retired in 1976. I was there, seeing all this happen as a kid in the wilderness, lost. I still remember watching those "big" machines moving the soil and lifting heavy materials with ease, wondering how could these machines do it so easily!!!

That must have given me the spark to pursue engineering. Completing my course in engineering from REC Trichy, I joined Cochin Refineries Limited in August 1982 after a brief stint of about 10 months in OEN, India Limited. We were 4 who were selected in the discipline of electrical and instrumentation.

It was KR that taught me electrical engineering. Being in the Maintenance department for a very long period, taught me the intricacies of Electrical engineering. We did learn a lot in college without understanding what those meant, but seeing and feeling those gave its actual meaning.

I did make a lot many mistakes while learning; some serious tripping of the plant. These were the best opportunities to learn for a fresh engineer. To site an example of how confident our seniors were about us, after having given very basic training on Gutor UPS at Switzerland, the then Director A P Krishnan, gave me the confidence and courage to erect and commission the imported Gutor UPS which I feel is the best support any young engineer can get in his professional career. I, along with Saju Thomas, another young technician, erected and commissioned that UPS successfully, which I still hold in high esteem.

I was fortunate and blessed to be sent abroad twice for training to enhance my skill level. First to study UPS in Switzerland and next on Secondment to the Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation, Nigeria as an analyzer and lab instrumentation maintenance advisor. Though I dare say that I was neither an expert nor a novice in the field, truly my organization had faith in my abilities to learn and perform in wherever or whatever conditions. During my two year stint there, I learnt and performed admirably well to the satisfaction of my employers at the same time keeping my institution's name always high. I felt blessed again with the opportunity to study at the University of Manchester, UK. I received a scholarship from the British Council through my organization that helped me acquire a Postgraduate degree in Engineering Project Management.

Being passionate about cricket, the organization helped likeminded folks form a cricket team. We were encouraged to play and through this, embrace the power of team spirit and camaraderie which did go a long way in discharging my duties in KR. It is the "beyond office" bondage that I'm carrying with me as I'm superannuating. This bond with my associates in KR was so strong that we wanted to continue even after retirement, and it ultimately brought forth the not for profit "Petropalace Cooperative Housing Society".




