The CCR Unit of MSBP at Kochi Refinery goes on-stream in record time. The ceremonial initiation of the unit was done by Mr.N Vijayagopal, Director (Finance) on 29 March 2021. With the product taken ONSTREAM and to STORAGE on 04 April 2021, the Continuous Catalytic Reforming (CCR) Unit became the second unit to successfully go on-stream at BPCL MSBP.

The world class CCR unit of Installed capacity 0.8 MMTPA is designed to convert Naphtha into high value Reformates for Motor Spirit and Hydrogen. The Hydro Treated Naphtha was taken into the CCR unit on 29 March 2021 in the presence of Mr. N Vijayagopal, Director (Finance), BPCL, Mr. Sanjay Khanna, Executive Director (Kochi Refinery), Mr. Ajith Kumar K, CGM (Projects) and senior executives of Kochi Refinery.

Big applause to team MSBP on accomplishing this two months ahead of schedule, braving all odds of the pandemic, with highest record of contractor safety and zero lost time accidents. Kudos to execution team led by Mr. Satheesh Kumar KP, GM (P), commissioning team led by Mr. Shajikumar MR, GM (Mfg-1) and all vendors, contractors and stakeholders for the non-stop dedicated efforts. NAPHTHA FEED CUT MARKS FIRST MILESTONE OF MSBP COMMISSIONING



The Motor Spirit Block Project (MSBP) is one of the flagship projects of Bharat Petroleum at Kochi Refinery for reducing Sulphur Content in fuels and converting Naphtha into value added fuels. At an approved capital cost of Rs. 3289 Crores, the MSB-Project marked its first commissioning milestone by taking the Naphtha Feed Cut – In to the Naphtha Hydro treating reactor on 24 March 2021.

Mr. P.V. Ravitej, Executive Director In-Charge (Refineries) graced the occasion along with Mr. Sanjay Khanna, Executive Director (Kochi Refinery), Mr. Ajith Kumar K, CGM (Projects) and Mr. Sankar M, CGM (Mfg). Mr. Ravitej congratulated the execution team led by Mr. Satheesh Kumar KP, GM (P), commissioning team led by Shri. Shajikumar MR, GM (Mfg-1) and business associates for the stupendous performance and clear track record of maintaining nil lost time accidents during the entire construction and commissioning phase.

FIRST EVER 220 KV GIS AT KR COMMISSIONED BY DIRECTOR (FINANCE)

The first ever 220 KV- Gas Insulated Substation (GIS) has been commissioned at Kochi Refinery. It was inaugurated by BPCL Director (Finance), Mr. N Vijayagopal in the presence of Mr. S. Khanna, Executive Director (Kochi Refinery), Mr. Ajith Kumar K, Chief General Manager (Projects), Mr.Chacko M Jose, Chief General Manager (Operations), Mr. Satheesh Kumar K P General Manager (Projects) and other BPCL, EIL and KSEB dignitaries on 29 March 2021.

Built with approx. Rs. 180 Crores, the 220KV, 200MW capacity GIS substation is capable of catering reliable Power to all Units of Kochi Refinery from the State and National Grids. The world class 220 KV GIS was delivered by multinational conglomerate General Electric Company. The jobs were awarded as a package to M/s GE in Dec 2018. Civil works commenced in March 2019 and was completed by October 2020. The 10000 M2 area - fully air conditioned two storied GIS building is equipped with 17 nos of 220KV GIS bays, Local Control Station, Relay control panels, 7 nos of 220 KV / 33 KV Power Transformers, Nitrogen Injection Fire Protection System, 2 Nos of 6.6KV/ 415V Station transformers, 33 KV GIS panels, 6.6KV switchgears and Electrical Control system (ECS).

The total length of 16,000M of 220KV cable was supplied, erected, tested and commissioned from Kerala State Electricity Board Ltd (KSEBL), Ambalamugal Substation to 220KV GIS by M/s KEI. The 2.1KM of RCC cable trench through the BPCL periphery was constructed by M/s SBCT and M/s Engineers India Limited, was the PMC for the project.



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RAINBOW PARK AT KOCHI REFINERY

Added most recently to the envious list of parks developed inside Kochi Refinery, is the *Rainbow Park* envisioned like the Eco Park with a wide variety of trees, herbal and medicinal plants. Mr. Ravitej P V, ED In-Charge, BPCL Refineries inaugurated the *Rainbow Park* at the serene precincts of the Rainwater Harvesting Pond at Kochi Refinery in the presence of Mr. Sanjay Khanna, ED(KR) and other senior executives on 24 March 2021. ED (KR) along with Chief General Managers, also planted saplings on the occasion. Members from Mumbai Refinery and other SBU's who are now part of the Kochi Refinery fraternity cherished the moment and planted saplings of various species of trees at the new park.

HSE-Environment together with Planning, Maintenance team supported this green initiative as part of their continuous greening journey in and around the Refinery. Each green initiative of Kochi Refinery, the *Eco park, Kalpakodyan, Amrutha Sarass, Varshodyan, Butterfly Parks* and the latest *Miyawaki Forest* in the PDPP area, stand testimony of our sincere efforts in continuing the clean green legacy of the biggest PSU Refinery in India. The rejuvenated rain water harvesting pond whispers our silent and sincere efforts to sustain the green development and conserving our water resources. This manmade lake, the newly developed Rainbow Park and the huge Rainwater Harvesting pond with around 2,87,340 M3 water reservoir spreading across 18.83 acres showcases our deep reverence for mother nature.

For BPCL, sustainability is not a word for statutes, but a legacy to live with and also to pass on. So when the rains fall, can rainbow parks be far behind?

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MIYAWAKI FOREST AT PDPP

INTERNATIONAL DAY OF FOREST 2021



Scripting another green story of BPCL, Mr. Sanjay Khanna, Executive Director, (Kochi Refinery) planted the first sapling of the Miyawaki Forest at Kochi Refinery to mark the International Day of Forests, 21 March 2021. Kochi Refinery has taken the technique pioneered by Japanese botanist Akira Miyawaki, to ensure that plant growth is faster and the resulting plantation is denser than usual. The Miyawaki Forest is coming up in the premises of the new Propylene Derivatives Petrochemical Complex that was dedicated to the nation by the Hon'ble Prime Minister recently. One third of the total area of the new PDPP Complex, which is around 40 acres, has been earmarked for green belt development. The green belt is being developed in the form of various parks such as *Herbal Parks, Fruit Parks, Bird parks and Bamboo Parks*, inside the PDPP premises.

The green belt development that started along with the construction activities of the complex is scheduled to be completed by the end of this month. Chief General Managers,

A N Sreeram & S Sriram along with the PDPP greening champions Bonu Lakshmana Rao & Shajimon B and other Refinery officials joined the drive to plant 400 saplings of 22 different species for the Miyawaki Forest that is being developed at various locations inside the Refinery under the guidance of Dr. N.C. Induchoodan, former Deputy Conservator of Forests in the Kerala Forest Department. In the current financial year 2020- 21 alone, BPCL has planted more than 20,000 tree saplings and 10,000 plant saplings of over 80 different species within the PDPP premises with most of the tree saplings being procured from the Agriculture University & Forest Department in Thrissur, Kerala
