"BPCL Refineries are like four pillars, supporting the edifice of the corporation and has made us self -sufficient as far as product is concerned," said Mr. Arun Kumar Singh, Chairman and Managing Director, BPCL with additional charge of Director (Marketing & Refineries).

Though NRL is no longer in our fold, we have the right over the entire production, shared C&MD, who began his conversation appreciating the strategically located refineries. In a chat with employees of Kochi Refinery on 10 Feb 2022, Mr. Arun Kumar Singh, expressed that, "Refineries are always benchmarked on a global scale. We have to think and act globally, since, in refining our competition is with international refiners like Saudi, Kuwait and Qatar.

Gone are the days when high refining margins could mask all the inefficiencies, C&MD reminded. Efficiency in operation and Cost optimization are key factors and it's a shared responsibility, where everyone has to contribute. "We have to build on our strengths and forge our presence in the emerging market trends and there is immense scope for optimization on all fronts in the Refineries, including manpower and energy efficiency. Going forward the game for refineries will be of Survival of the Fittest. So any Refinery which has least environment impact, best reliability and is cost-efficient will survive," Mr. Singh shared.

- Also appreciated the exemplary work for completing the PDPP project through remote commissioning without onsite support from licensors and OEMs.

Mr. Singh gave a broad outline of future investments of BPCL which he termed as the 6 pillars of our temple of aspirations, namely **Petrochemicals, Renewables, New Businesses (Consumer Retailing), Gas, EVs** and **Upstream**. An Ethylene Cracker at Bina Refinery and Polypropylene Plant at Kochi Refinery are the main Petchem projects in the pipeline. A new BU has been formed for Renewables that is targeting 1 GW by 2025 and 10 GW by 2040. Under New Business initiatives, 1000 consumer retailing stores are planned by 1st half of 2022-23. Likewise expansion in GAS is proposed, both in CNG and PNG and 7000 energy stations in next 5 years are coming up soon for supporting EVs, of which 1000 will be up in 2022-23. In Upstream the focus will be on investments in Brazil and Mozambique.

C&MD met with a cross section of the Refinery on his first visit to Kochi Refinery after taking over as C&MD and also his first in 2022. C&MD congratulated KR team for the uninterrupted supplies of petroleum products during the COVID pandemic and also appreciated the exemplary work for completing the PDPP project through remote commissioning without onsite support from licensors and OEMs.

Mr. K Ajith Kumar Executive Director (Kochi Refinery) welcomed C&MD with the traditional ponnada of Kerala and delivered the welcome address. Mr. Chacko M Jose, proposed the vote of thanks.

C&MD also had a brief interaction with the audience and gave a patient hearing to representatives of the trade unions who submitted their petitions for the kind consideration of the BPCL Board.



KOCHI REFINERY HOSTS PROCESS SAFETY WEBINAR

"Early prediction and planning are required to ensure high standards in Mechanical Integrity, which is a key factor in improving reliability and operational excellence for continued operation," said Mr. Ajith Kumar K, Executive Director (Kochi Refinery).

Mr. Ajith Kumar was delivering the inaugural address of the fourth edition of the National Seminar on Process Safety Management. ED(KR) spoke in detail on the importance of systematic approach to Turnaround management incorporating PSM elements. He also stressed on the importance of Contractor Safety as contract personnel also play a key role in successful Turnaround management.

Even though Process Safety has evolved over the years, the recent spate of accidents across India in HPCL Vizag, IOCL Haldia, and IOC Barauni indicated need for the focus on the importance of Process Safety related to Turnarounds. Needless to say, for excellence in operations and safety we have to ensure that the Turnarounds are managed incorporating PSM principles so as to complete the turn around without any Loss of primary containment (LOPC) and to ensure that integrity of the plant is maintained throughout their life cycle, ED(KR) said.

PSM webinar on "Process Safety & Turnaround" was orgnanised on 15th February 2022 on MS Teams platform given the pandemic restrictions on onground events and travel. The webinar aimed at propagating Process Safety as a stimulant for enhancing safety during Turnaround by proper planning, execution and complying the Pre-Start up checks to avoid incidents and accidents during the Turnaround. More than 135 participants joined the webinar from BPCL group Refineries (MR, KR & BR), Corporate HSSE, OISD, HMEL Bhatinda, Reliance Industries, IOC Haldia, HPCL Vizag and Air Products, Kochi.



This seminar gives a push to the second phase of the PSM program (PSM V.2.0) and also awakens the importance of planning and risk management for the IREP Turnaround at BPCL-Kochi Refinery. All efforts at the Refinery are continuously aimed at ensuring that the 17 elements of Process Safety Management implemented at Kochi Refinery are upheld at all times. The key objectives being in setting new benchmarks in the field of Process Safety to streamline our processes, strike a good balance between processes and safety thus enhancing safety and productivity.

MASTI BHARI KOCHI-THEKKADY

Being a couple who loves traveling around the world and India, Corona was the deadly enemy who literally changed our colorful and multi-dimensional life to black and white and monotonous. And, here we are in God's own country KERALA, a state filled with so many attractions. Kerala has something for every kind of traveller. From thrilling adventure activities to houseboats, from mesmerizing hill stations to romantic beaches, from temples to pubs, from amusement parks to wildlife, Kerala has it all.

Last February, Anshu and I drove down to a superb destination situated at the border of Kerala and Tamil Nadu - Thekkady. Taking its name from the multitude of Teak trees, Thekkady is near the Periyar National Park and close to the small town, Kumily. The names Thekkady and Kumily are often mistaken as one. In fact, Thekkady is where the Wildlife Sanctuary is located and Kumily is the place where we normally stay; both are just 2 -3 kms apart. Thekkady is a 170 kms drive from Cochin and it takes approximately 5 hours to reach there. The entire route is very scenic and you are feasted to soothing greenery and beautiful architecture.

Setting out at about 9.00 am after breakfast, we reached around 3.00 pm and headed straight for a boat ride that took us right around the Wildlife Sanctuary through the Periyar Lake. To see the wild animals during this boat ride, one needs to be very quiet. The Mullapperiyar Dam is the other wonder sight on this boat ride. Let me also add, the Dam and the Periyar wildlife sanctuary can be seen only on the boat ride and cannot be accessed by road.

Once you enter the Tiger reserve, you can see a temple and moving forward, you get to the boating area. The nature walk and the boat ride are the *must-takes* at Thekkady. There are three hotels inside this reserve; *KTDC Lake Palace, KTDC Aranya Nivas* and a budget hotel *KTDC Periyar House*. If your stay is in any of these hotels, make sure you reach the hotel before 5PM, as the entry gates will be closed after this.

After the lovely boating we decided to spend our evening with *Kathakali & Kalaripayattu* show followed by dinner. Most of the hotels in Thekkady are in the town itself and only a few require additional travelling. Make sure you select your preferences at the time of booking itself. Some resorts at Thekkady have Tree houses and vast grounds that you can roam around inside the resort itself.

On day two, we set out for the Jungle Safari early in the morning through the Gavi village. Gavi's evergreen forests are abundant with wildlife and over 250 species of birds. There was hardly any road and the bumpy jeep ride on a chilly morning was absolutely thrilling! We recollect each and every moment even now. We also went on the nature walk which is a guided two-hours walk inside the Periyar Tiger reserve. For the rest of the day we explored the local area and most importantly, shopping. On our last day, we explored the spice garden, tree plantation and Ramakkalmedu.

A drive down to Thekkady, is thrilling, soothing and satisfying. To us it was a beautiful trip, that took us very close to Kerala's scenic wonders. I recommend that one should visit the place at least once when you are single, double and also with the extended family. Thekkady is my guaranteed pick for wonder spots near Kochi!


