FIRST CONSIGNMENT OF 2 EHA **FLAGGED OFF FROM KOCHI REFINERY**

It was another historic moment for Bharat Petroleum when the first consignment of 2 Ethyl Hexyl Acrylate (2 EHA) from the Propylene Derivative Petrochemical (PDP) complex was dispatched from Kochi Refinery. The 2 EHA is the last of the series of six niche petrochemical products from BPCL.

Mr. Ajith Kumar K, Executive Director, (Kochi Refinery) appreciated the concerted efforts of all team members for crossing this prestigious milestone. ED (KR) flagged of the trucks containing the 2 EHA to the first customers M/s Asian Paints in Satara and M/s Visen Industries in Chennai on 21 February 2022, in the presence of senior officials from BPCL.

Chief General Managers Mr. Chacko M Jose (Operations) and Ms. Geeta Iyer (Finance) handed over the Sale Documents to Mr.Teekam Singh, Territory Manager (I&C). Mr. AN Sreeram, Chief General Manager (Project Technical & PETCHEM) welcomed the gathering and Mr. V Karunanidhi, GM(OM&S) proposed the vote of thanks.

The 2 EHA finds application as a raw material, to make adhesives, coatings, construction materials, acrylic rubber, and emulsions. The niche Petrochemicals are being manufactured at the Petrochemical Complex which was dedicated to the nation by Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi, in February last year. Built at the cost of Rs 6,000 crore, the complex has an Acrylic Acid Unit, Acrylates Unit & Oxo-Alcohol Unit of world scale size and capacity and will substitute the import of Acrylic Acid and save approximately Rs 4,000 crore in foreign exchange. Acrylic acid unit is the largest single train unit in the world with capacity of 160,000 MTPA.





NEW DIRECTOR REFINERIES INAUGURATES NEW BUTTERFLY PARK

Team Kochi Refinery was elated to welcome Mr. Sanjay Khanna on his maiden visit to Kochi Refinery as the Director of BPCL Refineries. Mr. Khanna was 'back home' to take a toll of the projects in progress at KR that were initiated under his leadership as Executive Director (Kochi Refinery). Mr. Sanjay Khanna took over as Director (Refineries) on 22 February 2022.

On his first visit as BPCL Director, on 01 March 2022, Mr. Khanna inaugurated a newly developed Butterfly Park in the presence of Mr. Ajith Kumar K, Executive Director (Kochi Refinery) and other senior officials of the Refinery.

The new Butterfly Park has been developed near the SRU-2 Unit in an area that was occupied by contractors' containers, sheds and scrap a few years back. Approximately 1000m2 area has now been transformed into this beautiful space that has plants like hibiscus, melestoma, kufiya, ixora, jatropha and more, all of which attract the winged beauty. The park also has three ponds with water lilies and lotuses.

Conceptualized by Mr. Shajikumar M R, GM (Mfg) and completed by the Maint (Civil) team under the leadership of Mr. Giridharan S, GM (Maint) and Mr. Johnson K, DGM (Maint), this is one more park at the refinery and one more effort in the direction of sustaining Kochi Refinery as a clean and green work-place.





SAFETY WEEK AT KOCHI REFINERY

MAKE OUR RELEVANCE FELT FOR A COMPASSIONATE WORLD

- Does it really take a lot to understand the inner strength of a woman?

Throwing sensible and sensitive questions, shaking the very thought processes and ideologies that we are born with, influenced by or accidentally accepted as normal, Dr. Aji C Panicker, prominent orator and well published author, had the women of Kochi Refinery take a whirlwind ride through the fallacies of many social rigmaroles on the Women's Day.



At the international women's day celebrations at Kochi Refinery on 08 March 2022, Dr. Aji C Panicker, Associate Professor, Mar Athanasius College, Kothamangalam, a gifted speaker, who holds a PhD in zoology and an active member of progressive literary forums, was successful not just in hurling harmless gibes but also in presenting known facts in a new light and convincingly resting her case with the biological truths behind why women are the embodiments of universal perfection. 

KEEP THAT "MASK MOUTH" HEALTHY

Mask mouth might create an inconvenience, but it's easy to deal with, by paying extra attention to your oral care along with protecting others from Covid-19 virus transmission. So, mask up & keep up with vour oral health.



During this pandemic it has become inevitable to wear a face mask to protect ourselves and others from risk covid 19 virus transmissions which is the part of our "new normal". For this very reason CDC recommends everyone to use face mask for protection. Since this pandemic has being extended further, we are forced to spend more time behind the mask in order to protect ourselves from infection, some people have noticed an unfortunate side effects from wearing mask for long periods of time includes bad breath and skin lesions around mouth.

According to many Canadian Dental Associations, they termed the phenomenon as 'Mask Mouth'. When you wear a face mask, the unavoidable mouth breathing caused by wearing a mask increases the dryness in your mouth. This creates a perfect breeding ground for bacteria and viruses to flourish. Because of decreased saliva production and flow in mouth, the useful properties of saliva such as creating a protective barrier, antimicrobial properties are impaired.

What is the actual impact of using face mask on our oral health?

- Bad breath -prolonged dryness in the mouth is the prefect environment for odour causing bacteria to thrive. This is called Halitosis. Many individuals have noticed this change in breath after wearing mask for long duration of time.
- Inflamed gums and tooth decay because of dryness of mouth, the saliva produced to flush food particles in our teeth is decreased allowing bacteria and viruses to flourish. As a result it will create inflammation of gums. This can eventually lead to periodontal disease which slowly damage your gums and bone structures of your mouth.
- Changes in pattern drinking of water and breathing behaviour while wearing mask most of the people try to breathe through their mouth to improve inhalation capacity. This all will leads to increased dry mouth and which in turn leads to various dental conditions.
- Trapping of air due to mask when you wear a mask we tend to trap more of carbon dioxide in your mouth which creates more acidic environment for bacterial build up and further dental problems.

To stay on top of your oral hygiene and avoiding halitosis and gum disease:

- Brush your teeth at least twice a day.
- Floss between the teeth
- Brush you tongue too
- Swish your mouth with non-alcohol based mouthwash before putting on a mask.
- While Mask on: Continue breathing through your nose and continue to Drink lots of waters throughout the day to Stay hydrated to prevent dryness of mouth.
- Take regular breaks during a day at work away from crowded area, if possible, to breathe in fresh air without mask.
- Avoid alcohol, sugary foods and acidic drinks to avoid creating of acidic environment in mouth.
- Eat a balanced and nutritious diet is good for your general and dental health.
- Keep up your regular dental appointments.
- Use clean mask replace regularly or clean your mask to prevent bacterial growth.
- For any skin lesions around the mouth which is due to contact with mask please consult your dermatologist.
