While they prime up, these would be bolstered b the core business of Refining and Marketing, said Mr. Arun Kumar Singh, Chairman & Managing Director at the 68th AGM of Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd in Mumbai on 27 September 2021. Mr. K. Padmakar, Director (HR), Mr. VRK Gupta, Director (Finance) and Ms. V Kala, Company Secretary were present along with the Chairman & Managing Director.

Mr. Singh shared that with the commissioning of the Propylene Derivative Petrochemical Project at Kochi Refinery, BPCL has joined the leaders in production of niche petrochemicals. We will increase our presence in petrochemicals space, integrating with our refining activity to diversify. BPCL will convert around 7000 conventional Fuel Stations into Energy Stations in medium to long term providing multiple fuelling options like petrol, diesel, flexi fuels, electric vehicle charging facility, CNG and eventually hydrogen. To participate in growing natural gas business our presence in CNG stations is going to grow manifold in the next few years. We also have extensive plans to scale up LNG business and set up requisite infrastructure and fueling stations.

With Indian retail market poised for exponential growth, BPCL is fully geared up to enhance footprints in non-fuel business that offers consumables, durables, and services by leveraging its assets, nationwide network of 19000+ Fuel Stations and 6100+ LPG Distributorships and relationships. BPCL has embarked upon a comprehensive digitalisation journey through its Project Anubhav initiative which enhances business process efficiencies, improves supply chain transparency, draws market intelligence, bolsters BPCL's marketing skills, provides unified view of customer to BPCL and vice-versa and takes customer engagement to the next level.

BPCL TO CONTRIBUTE ₹ 2 CRORE FOR KERALA VACCINATION DRIVE

Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited has committed a contribution of ₹ 2 Crore for the vaccination drive of Government of Kerala. The commitment letter was presented to Mr. Pinarayi Vijayan, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Kerala by Shri Sanjay Khanna, Executive Director (BPCL- Kochi Refinery) on 24 September 2021 in Thiruvananthapuram.

Dr K Elangovan, Principal Secretary (Industry), Mr. D Bhalamurali, Managing Director, Kerala Medical Service Corporation Limited (KMSCL), Mr. Kurian P Alapatt, Chief General Manager (HR), Mr. A N Sreeram, CGM (PETCHEM), Mr. George Thomas, GM (PR), Mr. D Kannabiran, State Head (Retail) and Mr. Vinod T Mathew, Manager (PR), were also present.

The support for vaccination drive is part of BPCL's ongoing initiatives to counter COVID 19 Pandemic in Kerala. Earlier during the onset of second COVID wave, BPCL had developed a plant to patient oxygen supply system by laying approx. 1 Km length SS pipeline from the plant to 1500-bed makeshift COVID treatment Centre. This facility was developed at the old campus of Cochin Refineries School, adjacent to the Refinery premises and was coordinated by the local administration. This is the first of its kind in the industry.

To support Government hospitals in combating COVID-19, liquid oxygen is being supplied from Kochi Refinery at no cost. In August 2021, BPCL commissioned three 500 LPM PSA Oxygen plants at Government General Hospitals in Thiruvananthapuram, Kozhikode and Kannur. To reach out far off regions in the event of the next wave, Oxygen bottling facility has been set up with a capacity of approx. 700 cylinders per day.

BPCL had also supported Government of Kerala in setting up ventilators in Ernakulam Medical College and Kannur Medical College and had enhanced medical facilities for COVID wards at various Government hospitals. During the lockdown, BPCL had directly reached out to the needy in the neighbourhood and tribal areas by providing food and hygiene kits and support to community kitchens. Extensive support was also extended in online education for school children.

KINFRA AND BPCL SIGN MOU FOR PETROCHEMICAL PARK AT KOCHI

Kerala Industrial Infrastructure Development Corporation (KINFRA) and Bharat Petroleum have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to co-operate in the Petrochemical Park project to be set up by KINFRA in Ambalamugal, Kochi. The MoU was signed between Mr. Santosh Koshy Thomas, Managing Director (KINFRA) and Mr. S Jena, Executive Director (Industrial & Commercial), BPCL in the presence of Shri P Rajeev, Hon'ble Industries Minister, Govt. of Kerala in Thiruvananthapuram on 24 September 2021. The target is to complete the project by 2024.

Targeting the industrial and economic growth of Kerala and job creation in the state, the Petrochemical park will be set up on 481 acres of land at Ambalamugal, Kochi. BPCL, a leading company in the petrochemical industry, has been allotted 171 acres of land under the scheme. Around 250 acres of land will also be allotted for petrochemical industrial units that operate on petroleum products and raw materials supplied by BPCL. BPCL will also provide support to industrial units arriving at the park. KINFRA and BPCL have decided to work together to establish and develop the park.

CELEBRATING THE 1000TH TRUCK OF NICHE PETROCHEMICALS

The 1000th truck carrying niche Petrochemicals was flagged off from BPCL Kochi Refinery by Mr. Sanjay Mehrishi, Chief General Manager (Information Systems) and Mr. Teekam Singh, Territory Manager (Industrial & Commercial) Kochi in the presence of Mr. Sanjay Khanna, Executive Director (Kochi Refinery) on 23 September 2021. The day was most auspicious for Kochi Refinery, as we turned 55 years on this day after the Refinery was inaugurated in 1966 by then Prime Minister of India Indira Gandhi.

The 1000th Petchem moment marks a milestone in the **Atmanirbhar** destiny of the country since niche petrochemicals are being produced and marketed in world scale economic size capacity for the first time in the country from Bharat Petroleum's Propylene Derivatives Petrochemical Complex at Kochi Refinery.

Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi had dedicated the complex on February 14, 2021. The cost of setting up the complex was ₹6,000 crore approximately. The complex uses 250,000 tonnes of propylene a year and produces Niche Petrochemicals as butyl acrylate, ethyl hexyl acrylate, acrylic acid, ethyl hexanol and normal butanol. The acrylic acid unit is the largest single train unit in the world (160,000 tonnes a year). Both acrylic acid and acrylates units are the first in the country. The first parcel of Niche Petrochemical from Kochi Refinery was flagged off on 14 April 2021. Since then 20,000 MT of products have been sold to various ancillary industries as paints and adhesives.

The billing invoice of the 1000th truck of PDPP was handed over to the customer representative by Mr. S Sriram, Chief General Manager (Engineering & Advisory Services). The 1000th truck dispatch of 2 Ethyl Hexanol consisted of conventional truck with a total quantity of 26.97 Metric Ton and was transported to the customer M/s.Payal Polyplast Pvt Ltd, Vagra, Gujarat.

"This is a proud moment for all of us in Bharat Petroleum. Niche petrochemical sector is a new area for us. However, we are learning the nuances of this complex sector and progressing towards fully energizing this petrochemical area, wishing many more 1000th soon," said Shri Khanna, Executive Director (Kochi Refinery). Chief General Managers, Shri Suresh John, Shri Ajith Kumar K, Shri Kurian P Alapatt, Shri A N Sreeram, Shri S Sriram, Smt Sarah Thomas, Shri G R Senthilkumar and KR team were also present at the flag-off function.

The residential tower has Ground +10 stories with a total plinth area of 9363 m2. There are 72 2 BHK flatsof 835 sqft each with all amenities for modern living. Spaces for social activities such as conference hall, dining hall, kitchen facilities ,clinic have also been accommodated in the tower.

Four lifts and four staircases satisfying all safety parameters have been provided to cater vertical movement of the inmates. Fire fighting installations and STP are also provided. The landscape of the three hillocks has been preserved while developing the area and the building has been designed to blend naturally with the lush green serene environment. The flats have been allocated and staff have also occupied many of the flats.


