# Oil and Steel Cos helping Combat Covid: Pradhan

Minister inaugurates a 500-bed Covid-19 hospital in Panipat

New Delhi: From augmenting the oxygen production and supply to establishing covid-care facilities, the oil and steel sector companies have been helping out in the war against Covid. As per a report by these two ministries, they together account for producing and supplying around 6,650 MT of medical oxygen out of the daily allocation of 10,000 MT in India. In addition,

the 13 oil PSUs are establishing more than 100 oxygen generation plants at different hospitals across the country.

"Under the leadership of PM Narendra

dustry have rallied together and are making every effort to help India combat the second wave of the Covid19 pandemic better and stronger," Pradhan wrote.

With demand for medical oxygen growing every day, the public and private sector steel plants have ramped up their daily production capacities. The production was 538 MT per day on April 1 which has now been increased to 4,278 MT on May 12. The steel plants also have a storage of 25,000 MT of oxygen currently which is supplied to states as per demand.

The oil PSUs are playing a major role in offering logistical support in carrying the oxygen to different states. The PSUs have contracted 207 ISO tankers with a capacity of 4214 MT to augment

the last mile deliveries of oxygen. These companies have also placed orders for high-capacity oxygen compressors for filling oxygen cylinders. Currently, all these tankers are being used to supply oxygen to 12 states.

Pradhan on Sunday was in Panipat to launch a 500-bed covid care hospital which has

Ambalamugal Government COVID Hospital having a total of thousand five hundred beds with direct oxygen supply from BPCL Kochi Refinery, neatly spaced and equipped for isolation as per protocol has been opened to the public. The COVID hospital set-up by the Government of Kerala in the Kochi Refinery premises is a well -planned facility for meeting the unique emergency that has risen in the wake of the second severe spike of COVID-19. Once again the Ernakulam District Administration and BPCL have partnered to deliver their continuous promise of reaching out to the needy , when they need it the most.

The first patient was received at the facility on 17 May 2021. Earlier, at the closure review with the BPCL team at Kochi Refinery on 15 May 2021, the Ernakulam District Collector, Mr S Suhas, IAS, appreciated the Refinery team for the full support extended to Government of Kerala right from providing the space for the COVID Hospital facilities in the two schools in the Refinery premises to the dedicated Oxygen supply to individual beds and also for the readiness to deliver uninterrupted power and water supply.

The make-shift hospital was set up by a technical team of Kochi Refinery along with the District Administration team in less than 7 days braving the onslaught of the Cyclone Tauktae and several other daunting obstacles of the COVID lockdowns.

In addition to the direct oxygen support to the make-shift hospital, BPCL is also focusing on other modes of oxygen supplies from Kochi Refinery with a well-laid out plan for the same. "In the challenge to fight the pandemic tooth and nail, we are totally in it to address the distress call for Oxygen that's coming in from so many different corners. We intend to strengthen support through liquid Oxygen supplies, gaseous oxygen supplies through pipelines and provide Oxygen generators in hospitals. We want to reach out Oxygen as much as we can. Saving precious lives, that's BPCL Kochi Refinery's top priority for now," said Mr. Sanjay Khanna, Executive Director (Kochi Refinery). "This is the first of its kind facility where Oxygen will be supplied directly from a process unit. We have stopped all the Oxygen usages temporarily within the Refinery and kept the facility dedicated for medical purpose only," Mr. Khanna, added.

During the peak of COVID 19 in October 2020, BPCL Kochi Refinery along with M/s Air Products initiated the supplies of medical grade liquid Oxygen. With this second wave in April 2021, BPCL has resumed medical grade liquid oxygen supplies from Kochi Refinery to government hospitals and also to CIAL Covid Centre, Aluva Taluk Hospital and PVS Covid Centre.

"Considering the dire emergency, a dedicated one kilometer long Oxygen line has been established to the COVID hospital from the Oxygen plant in the FCC unit of Kochi Refinery. The challenging job was executed by a dedicated team, who worked round the clock and completed the entire activity in less than 7 days," said Chief General Manager (Operations), Mr. Chacko M Jose. "The stainless steel pipeline complies with all safety measures and has the facility for connecting the backup arrangement. Through this line alone we can up supply up to 15 tonnes of Oxygen per day," detailed Mr. Chacko.

"Last year, as advised by the Central and State machinery, BPCL initiated the COVID first line treatment centre (CFLTC) at the Refinery school. The CFLTC continues to operate with the support of the medical team from M/s Sudheendra Mission Hospital. The school auditorium that has now been converted to the Govt. COVID hospital is only a block away from this CFLTC," said Mr. Kurian Alapatt, Chief General Manager (HR) who is in charge of these facilities.

"This oxygen supply system by BPCL, through pipelines, trucks and the oxygen generators for general hospitals are tokens of BPCL's undying commitment to the immediate society and to the nation at large. BPCL has been the first to rise into action at each and every call of catastrophic distress in Kerala. Be it the floods or the pandemic, we are committed in our contributions to the social development of the State as much as we are in our responsibilities as a leading Refiner," Mr. Khanna reassured.

The District Programme Manager (National Health Mission), Dr. Mathews Numpeli and Sub Collector, Fort Kochi, Dr. Haris IAS, Mr.Sanjay Khanna, Executive Director (Kochi Refinery), Mr.Kurian P Alapatt, Chief General Manager (HR), Mr.Chacko M Jose, Chief General Manager (Operations) and Mr. George Thomas, General Manager (PR& Admin) joined the walk-through with the District Collector, along with KR team members from Manufacturing, Process, Maintenance, Estates, HSE & Public Relations on 15 May 2021.

Team BPCL prays that the pandemic disappears very soon and also wish all people who would have to use the facility a very speedy recovery.

## **UNITE TO CRUSH THE CURVE PUSH THE PANDEMIC OUT**

A LOOK AT THE **INITIATIVES** AT KOCHI REFINERY **DURING THE INITIAL PERIOD. LOCKDOWNS** AND THE **SECOND WAVE** OF COVID 19

Ever since COVID 19 cases were detected first time in India at Thrissur, Kerala, among medical students retuning from Wuhan in January 2020, BPCL Kochi Refinery has been meeting the challenges of the pandemic through various community initiatives. The Initiatives come under three periods of the pandemic as detailed below:

#### **INITIAL PERIOD**

During the beginning stages, that is by the beginning of February 2020, KR started creating awareness about the disease among employees, contract workers and neighbouring public. We had started establishing different protocols in the work site. we also developed our own hand sanitizer Aroma which is being used all over the refinery.

By the middle of March 2020, we were aware of the gravity of the situation and at that stage, medical experts and National Health Mission had brought to our attention that there is a dearth of Personal Protective Equipment for health workers and shortage of Intensive Care Units.


Based on this input and requests from State Government and Indian Medical Association, Kochi Refinery took up the following initiatives under Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) in the middle of March itself:

- ICU Units for Government Hospitals of Three Districts:
  - (a)ICU Unit at Government Medical College, Ernakulam with three ventilators
  - (b) Seven (7) ventilators for ICU Unit at Government Medical College,
  - (c) Facilities for ICU units at General Hospital, Pathanamthitta and District Hospital, Kozhenchery of the same district (These four hospitals were identified because Ernakulam, Kannur and Pathanamthitta showed high surge in the initial days)
- PPE kits for health workers and hand sanitisers to public

#### **LOCKDOWNS & BEYOND**

National level Lockdown was declared on 25 March 2020. Starting from this period, KR initiated a range of programmes to reach out to the underprivileged of the society, especially those in the vicinity. BPCL supported various welfare schemes during FY 2020-21. Some of these include:

#### • Infrastructure for Government Hospitals:

- (a) Facilities for inpatient COVID care including patient cots and bed and drip stands for Taluk Head Quarters Hospital, Sulthan Bathery,
- (b) Lab Equipment and facilities for neighbouring Primary Health Centre, Maneed,
- (c) Generator sets for Taluk Head Quarters Hospital Kothamangalam catering to COVID Patients
- (d) Renovation and facilities for Casualty Block of Government Hospital, Muvattupuzha, Eastern end of Ernakulam district

#### • Strengthening COVID Care Mechanism in Kochi:

- (a) Support extended to run the COVID 19 War Room of the District that coordinates tracking of COVID contacts, patient admission, telemedicine etc
- (b) District Administration had converted a closed-down hospital into Government COVID Apex Centre for controlling the surge and extending care in Kochi city and suburbs. BPCL had supported the medicine and consumables for few months
- (c) Fuel Support to Kerala Police for Motor Cycle patrolling
- (d) Support of Covid 19 awareness campaign by District Administration

#### • Support to CFLTCs:

In order to streamline the medical Care, COVID First Line Treatment Centres (CFLTC) were opened by the State Government. Infrastructure support was given to such CFLTCs coordinated by the District Administration and neighbouring Local Self Governments.

#### • Direct Support For Poor in Neighbourhood:

- (a) Food & sanitization kits and medicine for poor in the neighboring areas of Kochi Refinery and its other facilities
- (b) Food kits for migrant labourers in Ernakulam
- (c) Support to Community Kitchen in neighbouring Municipality.

#### • Support for Online education for Children of poor families:

- (a) 500 Television sets for online education for marginalised students in four districts of Kerala
- (b) Television sets at SC/ST centres in neighbouring panchayats

#### • Post-COVID Medical Camp:

National Health Mission initiated a series of medical camps for the poor in the district having Post-COVID complication. BPCL is supporting this effort called as Punarjani Post Covid clinic

#### Liquid Oxygen Supply:

KR along with its business partner Air Products also supplied Liquid Oxygen when the average daily cases spiked in October-November 2020.

All these schemes were supported under the CSR and Enterprise Social Commitment (ESC) projects of Kochi Refinery. Continued on next page >>>

#### **COMBATING THE SECOND WAVE OF COVID 19 SPREAD**

In the present pandemic situation, Kochi Refinery is mainly focusing on the Oxygen supply for the society. BPCL Kochi Refinery is providing Gaseous Oxygen, power, water and infrastructure to a 500-bed make-shift COVID treatment centre at the old campus of Cochin Refineries School, adjacent to its premises, in Ambalamugal, Kerala. Gaseous Oxygen is being produced in the VPSA Plants at Kochi Refinery. This make shift COVID treatment centre established by Ernakulam District Administration has been expanded to 1,500 beds in phases.

In view of the second surge, BPCL along with its business partner Air Products commenced the supply of medical oxygen from Kochi Refinery again this year from 19 April 2021. BPCL is supplying around 3.5 tonnes per day of Liquid oxygen to Government Hospitals in Ernakulam District from this facility. As of 26 May 2021, 140 Tonnes of Oxygen has been distributed during the second surge. Last year, BPCL supplied 46 tonnes of medical oxygen when the average daily cases spiked in October-November 2020. The build-own-operate (BOO) unit of Kochi Refinery has a provision to produce and store liquid oxygen of 99.7% purity.

Presently we are also supporting many projects from neighbouring Local Self Governments, NGO and other stake holders that include food kits and medicines to COVID Positive and guarantined people from economically and socially backward families, ICU Beds & Ventilators and PPE kits, sanitizers and more.

Various groups inside the Refinery are also helping the needy in their communities. When it comes to saving lives, we don't have to think twice, every life is precious. Together let's help in whatever way we can.

## CURBING THE CURVE INSIDE THE REFINERY

The biggest challenge we faced inside the Refinery during the second wave of COVID 19 is shortage of employees once the infection started to spread severely. Quick steps taken to alert employees and avert the spread include:

- All mandates of Central, State and Corporate duly noted and complied with
- Clear SOPs and guidelines given for employees travelling within the state and outside the state. Rescheduling working hours and canteen hours to prevent over-crowding.
- Screening of all employees by means of temperature scanners at Gate and entrance Visitors restricted into Refinery premises

- Constant communication through regular channels, digital and social media platforms for awareness
- Regular fumigation and sanitization of all work sites and premises to prevent spread


- Weekly covid testing facility at OHC for primary contacts of both employees and contract employees.

  CFLTC for employees and dependents with sufficient supply of medicines and Oxygen along with ambulance support activated

  24/7 working OHC for treatment and medical queries

- Daily follow-up of COVID 19 positive employees and family through tele-consultation by OHC doctors. Timely referral of all sick employees and family under quarantine to COVID CARE tertiary centre and
- - Organizing vaccination drives to ensure all groups are vaccinated at the earliest

## **2 ETHYL HEXANOL LAUNCHED AT KOCHI**

Moving on a very fast pace and close on heels of the first product, the second one also has been launched from the world class Oxo Alcohol Unit of Bharat Petroleum Propylene Derivative Petrochemical Complex at Kochi Refinery. The 2 ETHYL HEXANOL, which has varied applications in downstream industries, was launched by Mr. Sanjay Khanna, Executive Director (Kochi Refinery) on 07 May 2021. The first dispatch trucks were flagged off by Mr.Suresh John, Chief General Manager (Projects Procurement), Mr.Kurian P Alapatt, Chief General Manager (Human Resources) I/C and Mr.Teekam Singh, Territory Manager (Industrial & Commercial).

Senior executives including Chief General Managers, Mr. Chacko M Jose (Operations), Mr.Ajith Kumar K (Projects), Mr.AN Sreeram (Project Technical & PETCHEM), Mr. S Sriram (Engineering & Advisory Services), Ms.Sarah Thomas (Employee Relations), Mr. Sankar M (Manufacturing), other invitees and team members witnessed the ceremony organised under strict COVID protocol. The first dispatch of 2 Ethyl Hexanol was in three conventional trucks and two ISO containers with a total quantity of 95.92 MT. We appreciate all the new customers for having trust in BPCL product quality from a new unit and thank them for maintaining all the protocols. The OXO ALCOHOL unit, which was commissioned in March 2021, uses LP Oxo Selector 30 technology and the unit, is designed to produce N-Butanol, 2 Ethyl Hexanol and I-Butanol. Of these, 2 ETHYL HEXANOL is particularly required for plasticizers used in PVC processing, specialty plasticizers, co-monomer in polyethylene resins for adhesive, cetane improvers and temperature resistant materials. Conceived and delivered entirely as a *Make in India* project, the BPCL Petrochemical Complex will largely benefit Indian paint, cosmetic, ink, plasticizers and many more downstream industries.



## DIGI PLATFORMS GO LIVE AT OXO ALCOHOL UNIT

After the successful commissioning of the PDPP units one after the other, the digital applications are now going onstream as well.
